CITY CENTRE CAMPUS

Centre of Excellence for Creative and Digital Industries

Our new build will be a landmark building in the centre of Manchester inspired by our City's rich industrial heritage.

Located opposite the Arena and Manchester Victoria Station, it is the first of a two-phase* vision for the site, and will become the home of the 'Centre of Excellence for Creative and Digital Industries', and the 'Arden School of Theatre' and 'Manchester Film School'.

It will boast two industry-standard theatres and two film studios as well as media, digital computing and editing suites, recording and photography studios, dance studios and rehearsal rooms and bespoke practical spaces for creative arts, media make-up and special effects. The campus will open in a phased basis from spring 2022.

*Phase two will see the creation of a Centre of Excellence for Business, Financial and Professional Services on the same site, following completion of the first and subject to the securing of additional funding.

CITYLABS CAMPUS

Centre of Excellence for Access to Higher Education

Located at the heart of the booming healthcare and health sciences innovation quarter, near Manchester's major specialist hospitals, our Citylabs site will enable people to gain the specialist access qualifications they need for higher education university courses in medicine, biomedical sciences and more.

OPENSHAW CAMPUS

Centre of Excellence for Health and Wellbeing (including Sport)

Sport students will have exclusive use of a new six court sports hall which will host five-a-side football, netball, basketball, badminton, volleyball and more.

There will be a brand new outdoor artificial pitch, ready to host football and American football, with an on-site gym, a professional standard strength and conditioning room and a sports laboratory.

For our healthcare students, the new health suite will provide a state-of-the-art hospital ward including an infectious disease area, a care room and a fullyfunctioning teaching and training nursery space and baby room.

Centre of Excellence for Construction and Logistics

Construction students will be taught in new workshops for a wide range of specialist and trade programmes, with electrical testing, brickwork, plumbing, plastering, painting and decorating, carpentry and joinery and a multidisciplinary area for larger projects.

There will also be a new immersive technologies laboratory and machine workshops, providing the perfect learning environment for motor vehicle and engineering students.

RADIOGRAPHY, ORTHOTICS AND PROSTHETICS

This Medical Health Professional programme is an Access to Higher Education Diploma, and is designed to help you on the path to studying a medical science related subject at university level. It's great for anyone who is looking for a change in career and needs the relevant re-training. You'll be required to study a number of different units in Mathematics, Physics, and Biology, focusing on developing the skills required for work in a variety of biological sciences and other Allied Health Professions such as Radiography, Orthotics and Prosthetics.

You'll cover topics like statistics, genetics and the properties of matter, as well as learning all about the cell and what it means to the human body. A part of the course will also include the development of personal skills to help you succeed at university, including study and research techniques and how to apply correctly for higher education degrees.

SOCIAL SCIENCE

Trying to understand people is part of human nature, but using the knowledge that we gain from this to help others is what sets the social scientist apart. Studying society gives us a quality of mind, which allows us to make the link between private lives and larger public issues. Being a social scientist is not simply an academic task, but also one that requires imagination, passion and personal reflection.

You will cover sociological theory, education, nonverbal communication and crime causation. You'll also develop all the skills you'll need for success at university too, including reflective practice, critical analysis, debate and research skills.

Progress to a BSc (Hons) Applied Psychology or HNC Healthcare Practice for England (Integrated Health and Social Care) at UCEN Manchester. GCSEs in both English and Maths at grade C/4 or above for this course. If you'd like to take the physics pathway rather than the biology route, you'll need to have a minimum of a Grade B/6 in Maths at GCSE.

We'll also invite you down for a short interview so that you can demonstrate your commitment and skills that will be required to complete this diploma.

Higher Level Professional Qualifications

We offer a range of professional development courses at UCEN Manchester, to enhance your understanding of a subject and develop your knowledge and skills, offering the opportunity to climb the ladder both academically and professionally.

BUSINESS

AAT PROFESSIONAL Diploma in Accounting | Level 4

This course is aimed at accounting professionals or individuals with in-depth accounting knowledge, wanting to gain entry into an accountancy career.

Students can choose to study during the day or evening. This will include one full day or two evenings throughout the duration of the course.

CIM Certificate in Professional Marketing | Level 4

Designed for those who are already employed in a marketing support role, or whose job sees them working with a variety of marketing elements, this Level 4 Certificate from the Chartered Institute of Marketing (CIM) is an ideal way to advance your skills and deepen your understanding of the discipline.

CILEx Diploma in Law and Practice | Level 6

Students enrolled on the CILEx Level 6 Diploma in Law and Practice are required to complete one practice unit, along with the corresponding law unit. In addition, students must undertake both mandatory professional skills units and are able to choose any two other law units.

CLC/SQA Diploma in Conveyancing Law and Practice | Level 4

This Level 4 Diploma is aimed at those who plan to become Registered Conveyancing Technicians in England and Wales. Having successfully completed this course, students may progress on to the Level 6 Diploma. To enrol on this course, you will need to have a AAT Level 3 qualification. All students will be initially assessed online for English and maths and interviewed to identify past achievements.

FINANCES

TUITION FEE LOAN

Student Finance England (SFE) will provide you with a loan for the full amount of your tuition fees, providing you meet certain eligibility criteria. This can be found here: gov.uk/student-finance/who-qualifies

It is recommended that you apply for your loan by the May before you start your course, but SFE will accept applications after this. The tuition fee loan is only available for students who haven't already got a degree or UK equivalent qualification. UCEN MANCHESTER BURSARY

The UCEN Manchester Bursary includes consideration for financial support in a variety of ways, from progression, to living costs and hardship issues. If you are struggling with your day-to-day finances, make an appointment with one of our 'Future U' Careers, Employability and Welfare Advisors who will work with you to maximise your income. We are here to guide you and offer support and, together, we can look at ways to improve your personal situation.

MAINTENANCE LOAN

A maintenance loan is available to help with your living costs while in higher education (e.g. accommodation, books and bills). All eligible students can get some maintenance support. The amount of money you can recieve depends on where you live and study. The maximum loan available is £8,944 (based on living away from home, outside London). This is paid directly into your bank account each term. Maintenance loans have to be paid back, but not until you have finished university and are earning over £25,000 a year.

The maintenance loan is paid directly to you in three instalments throughout the academic year. You will receive instalments in September, January and April.

UCEN Manchester also offer a range of discretionary bursaries and funds to help break down barriers that may prevent you from committing to study and reaching your potential.

AM I ELIGIBLE FOR FUNDING?

Your eligibility for student funding will depend on your nationality, residency, previous study and the type of course you are applying for. Depending on your personal circumstances, you may be able to access extra funding, such as childcare allowance. HOW TO APPLY

FULL TIME COURSES STARTING IN SEPTEMBER 2021 AND JANUARY 2022

If you are applying for a full-time Honours Degree, Foundation Degree (including those with a preparatory year), Higher National Certificate or Diploma, you will need to apply via UCAS. You can search for a course on our website **ucenmanchester.ac.uk**, or through UCAS courses. Please note that not all of our courses have both a September and January start date. Please check the website for further details.

You can start your application on UCAS apply - you will need to register and create a user account. This means you can complete your application at your own speed and track your application after you have submitted it.

Remember, you can only submit one UCAS application per cycle, so all the courses you want to apply for have to be on the same application. There are some helpful resources on the UCAS website if you encounter any problems.

If you are applying to UCEN Manchester, you will need our institution code 'M10' for when you complete your UCAS application.

COSTS TO APPLY

To apply in 2021/22, the application fee is:

YOUR UCAS BUZZWORD

If you are currently at school or college, you will need a buzzword from your tutor or careers advisor. This is like a password unique to your school or college that allows you to register your application with UCAS. Your school or college will then add a reference and submit your application.
