What would you say are the top requirements for someone entering this line of work?

Discipline, punctuality, humility, hard work, dedication and honesty. Honesty not just towards others and in your work, but most importantly being honest and true to yourself, who you are, what you stand for and what you believe in. Oh, I almost forgot... You need to be thick skinned too.

What are the most challenging aspects of your current job?

One of the most challenging aspects about my job is breaking personal barriers and stepping out of my comfort zone when it comes to learning new things. Also having to prepare my mind and my body for very long, tiring and physical rehearsal days.

What are some of the accomplishments you're most proud of in your career so far?

I think working with one of the most decorated writers, directors and visionaries for the arts of our time, is one that sticks out to me.

Kwame Kwei-Armah was the director on "One Love - The Bob Marley Musical", so being able to work closely with and to learn from him was an amazing experience. But to top it all off, the show came to my home town of Birmingham where I was able to play the main stage at The Birmingham Repertory Theatre.

How did your experience at The Arden prepare you for what you are doing today?

My Arden experience prepared me for every eventuality, from screen to stage, to voice over work, and even down to being selfemployed and looking after my accounts and affairs as an actor.

Based at The Arden School of Theatre, in the heart of Manchester, our BA (Hons) Acting for Live and Recorded Media course is designed to offer industry specific and creative units that develop artists for the future.

It will provide high quality vocational training and education for practitioners who can respond to the traditional and contemporary demands of the performance industry and its allied sectors.

Students will be encouraged to develop a flexible approach to the processes by which performance is created, characterised by a committed and consistent professional work ethic that is able to adapt to different performance contexts.

The course will foster in its graduates the ability to utilise critical and analytical skills in developing ideas and constructing arguments, in order to produce their own work in terms of personal and professional development.

It will instil in its students an understanding of their chosen specialisms that will enable them to develop their careers upon graduation.

This is the course for those wanting to bring their own creative ideas, skills and passion for dance and performance to a constantly changing industry. For the technically versatile and imaginative dancers, choreographers, community artists, and teachers. A programme for the 21st century dance artist; the performers, the creators, and the innovators.

This practically-led course aims to equip you with the technical, creative, collaborative, and entrepreneurial skills to be able to work in a wide variety of contexts. Among other things, you will learn a wide range of dance techniques; perform in shows; create work and devise pieces; teach in the community; develop a portfolio including a professionally filmed showreel; work with visiting choreographers and directors, and also create and perform in your own festival.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You will need 80 UCAS points in a related subject area. We strongly recommend that all applicants have GCSE English Language and Maths A*-C, or Level 9-4.

Applicants are required to attend a workshop audition and interview that will take place on a single day, lasting approximately five hours.

For international/distance auditions, applicants should submit a four minute portfolio of class work that demonstrates their technical skill in at least two styles, and a two to three minute solo performance in any style. There will also be a short Skype interview on a mutually convenient date after this has been received.

Musical Theatre

BA (Hons)

OVERVIEW

The Arden School of Theatre offers Musical Theatre tuition from an international faculty of industry professionals.

Develop your potential for excellence as a triple threat over our three year Musical Theatre degree.

The first year of the course focuses on the core techniques of Musical Theatre: acting, dance, and singing. You will also be taught supporting skills such as accents/dialects, music theory, and performance technique.

The second year moves into more project based work. You will perform mini-scale musicals from the historical and contemporary repertoire and devise your own musical as a year group, while continuing to refine the skills required for professional musical theatre performance.

The final year supports you in becoming a Musical Theatre professional, learning audition techniques in order to gain that all important first job upon graduating. You will perform two full scale musicals with a professional orchestra and technical team in one of our in-house theatres, as well as perform industry showcases in Manchester and London. You will also learn to record a professional vocal reel and be guided through your professional development including CVs, headshots, budgeting, and tax returns.

Graduates from the course can be seen in the West End, in tours in the UK and Europe, and performing around the globe on luxury cruise liners such as Celebrity, Royal Caribbean and Norwegian Cruise lines.

Manchester enjoys an impressive international theatre scene with an everincreasing amount of northern-based theatre agents, with MediaCityUK on the doorstep. There are also many museums and libraries, an impressive Manchester shopping experience and a diverse, multicultural nightlife. It is the perfect place to pursue your professional theatrical training.

Vocal Studies and Performance

BA (Hons)

OVERVIEW

Vocal Studies and Performance at The Arden School of Theatre offers a comprehensive programme that explores multiple sectors of vocal performance, aiming to prepare students for the professional performance industry.

The aim of the programme is to train and support professional vocalists in multi-genre performance including both musical theatre and pop music vocals with the scope to explore any genre the students would like to specialise in. The course is fast-paced and heavily practical, encouraging students to explore their individual artistic interests in order to develop as practitioners. The course is ideal for those with a passion for singing and a desire for a career in the performance industry.

The Arden School of Theatre utilises its working links with the professional community to provide the most up to date knowledge of vocal techniques and professional requirements. The programme explores a number of modules which engage students in performance technique and skills. The modules are designed to explore the voice as an instrument and understand the theory behind how we control it.

Each year of the programme has a unique focus in providing students with the techniques and knowledge of the voice. The first year will focus on the technical side of the voice which will then be applied to given challenges that you could face in the industry in the second year. The final year focuses on professional development and the modules are designed to give you the skills needed to market yourself as a professional vocalist

Performance **Practice**

MA

OVERVIEW

Please note, this course is delivered across both UCEN Manchester and Sheffield Hallam University.

The Performance Practice MA will enable you to articulate and share your creative practice; foster and develop your connections with creative communities; study around your existing responsibilities and develop your skills on a creative retreat and apply them in your ongoing practice.

On this course, you will utilise your background in performance to further enhance your career. You will study the work of performance artists and companies, and learn how to develop your individual identity as a performance practitioner.

The course is designed to fit around people with existing employment and/or industry commitments. Teaching will take place in the evenings and at weekends with some content available online, as a supplement to your learning and research.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You will need an undergraduate degree in Performance, Theatre. Acting or a related discipline (e.g. Dance), with a minimum 2:1 classification.

All applicants need to apply online through to Sheffield Hallam University and will then be interviewed.

AUDITION INFORMATION

ACTING FOR LIVE AND RECORDED MEDIA

The auditions for this course are completed in two rounds. One between January-March and a recall day at the end of March/Start of April.

All students will participate in a group warmup, conduct a short screen test and perform a Shakespeare monologue (from a selected list confirmed before audition). Some students will be invited to stay to be directed on their pieces. After this initial audition you will be informed whether you have been successful for the recall audition and provided further information.

DANCE AND PERFORMANCE

This audition is completed in one day. Students are required to:

- Participate in a commercial dance warm-up and routine
- Participate in jazz, contemporary and partner work dance routines.
- Take part in a short creative workshop.
- Performa a solo in any genre no longer than 2 minutes and 30 seconds. This should demonstrate both creative and technical skills (please provide music on your phone, ipod or CD).
- Undertake a short individual interview.

MUSICAL THEATRE

The audition is held in two rounds. One Between January-March and a recall day at the end of March/Start of April.

The first round will consist of a group singing and group dance warmup. Applicants will need to prepare two contrasting songs (of approximately 32 bars) with sheet music, perform a contemporary monologue, and partake in a dance audition. After this initial audition you will be informed whether you have been successful for the recall audition and provided further information.

THEATRE AND PERFORMANCE

The audition for this course is in three parts on the same day:

- A workshop to show how you work in a group, your creative skills, and sense of play.
- An audition speech that gives you the opportunity to demonstrate your performance skills, understanding of text, and how well you deal with direction and experimentation.
- An interview to provide an opportunity to meet with the panel members and discuss your experience.

VOCAL STUDIES AND PERFORMANCE

All students will participate in a group singing warmup and should prepare two songs of contrasting genres (e.g Theatre and Pop/Jazz). Sheet music should be provided however one song may be sung with backing track. You will also be interviewed by a member of the team to provide an opportunity to discuss your experience.

FINANCES

As well as offering high quality courses, UCEN Manchester charge some of the lowest tuition fees in the UK. There's lots of help available to make sure you can afford your education and enjoy your time with us.

TUITION FEE LOAN

Student Finance England (SFE) will provide you with a loan for the full amount of your tuition fees. The fees for our part-time courses will be charged on a pro-rata basis, depending on the number of credits being studied. This money will be paid directly to the institution. To apply to Student Finance England, please visit: gov.uk/apply-for-student-finance

It is recommended that you apply for your loan by the May before you start your course, but SFE will accept applications after this. The tuition fee loan is only available for students who have not already got a degree or UK equivalent qualification. If you already have a degree qualification, please contact us via the details at the bottom of this page.

UCEN MANCHSTER BURSARY

The UCEN Manchester Bursary includes consideration for financial support in a variety of ways, from progression, living costs and hardship issues. If you are struggling with day-to-day finance, make an appointment with one of our 'Future U' Careers, Employability and Welfare Advisors who will work with you to maximise your income. We are here to guide you and offer support and, together, we can look at ways to improve your situation.

AM I ELIGIBLE FOR FUNDING?

Your eligibility for student funding will depend on your nationality, residency, previous study and the type of course you are applying for. Depending on your personal circumstances, you may be able to access extra funding, such as childcare allowance.

MAINTENANCE LOAN

A maintenance loan is available to help with your living costs while in higher education (e.g. accommodation, books and bills). All eligible students can get some maintenance support. The amount of maintenance loan you can get depends on where you live and study. The maximum loan available is £8,944 (based on living away from home, outside London). This is paid directly into your bank account each term. Maintenance loans have to be paid back, but not until you have finished university and are earning over £25,000 a year.

The maintenance loan is paid directly to you in three instalments throughout the academic year. You will receive instalments in September, January and April.

UCEN Manchester also offer a range of discretionary bursaries and funds to help break down barriers that may prevent you from committing to study and reaching your potential.

HOW TO APPLY

Applying for a course at UCEN Manchester is simple. The process depends on whether the course you are applying for is full or part-time, so we have put together everything you need to know below.

FULL-TIME COURSES STARTING IN SEPTEMBER 2020 AND JANUARY 2021

If you are applying for a full-time Honours Degree, Foundation Degree (including those with a preparatory year), Higher National Certificate or Diploma, you will need to apply via UCAS. You can search for a course on our website ucenmcr.tmc.ac.uk, or through UCAS courses. Please note that not all of our courses have both a September and January start date. Please check the website for further details.

You can start your application on UCAS apply – you will need to register and create a user account. This means you can complete your application at your own speed and track your application after you have submitted it.

Remember, you can only submit one UCAS application per cycle, so all the courses you want to apply for have to be on the same application. There are some helpful resources on the UCAS website if you encounter any problems.

If you are applying to UCEN Manchester, you will need our institution code 'M10' for when you complete your UCAS application.

COSTS TO APPLY

To apply in 2020/21, the application fee is:

• £18 if you are applying to just one course*;

or

• £24 for multiple courses (and for late applications sent after 30 June).

YOUR UCAS BUZZWORD

If you are currently at school or college, you will need a buzzword from your tutor or careers advisor. This is like a password unique to your school or college that allows you to register your application with UCAS. Your school or college will then add a reference and submit your application.

Your tutor or careers advisor can explain how you apply to UCAS and whether there are any internal deadlines you need to stick to.

MATURE STUDENTS, OR THOSE NOT CURRENTLY AT SCHOOL OR COLLEGE

UCEN Manchester encourages all applications, including those from people who are returning to education after a time away.

You will still need to apply via UCAS as an independent applicant and write a personal statement, which needs to be between 1,000 and 4,000 characters. This is your opportunity to tell us about any additional skills or experience you may have, as well as why you want to study your chosen course. You can include examples of voluntary or work experience, as well as career aspirations and personal qualities that will help you study.

You will also need to provide details of a referee who can confirm your suitability to study at higher education level.
