# **Key points**

UCEN Manchester is a trading name of the LTE Group, for the delivery of higher education provision. The mission of LTE Group is "Improving lives and economic success through learning and skills". ### Financial help available

For many students, especially those from low-income backgrounds or those without substantial financial support from their families, the cost of living can pose a significant barrier to accessing and completing their education. By providing eligible students with financial support, referred to here on in as the 'UCEN Manchester Bursary', this aims to alleviate the financial pressure caused by the increased cost of living on students most in need.

The UCEN Manchester Bursary provides financial support towards the cost of studying and more specifically will offer support for: Maintenance with respect to cost of living; Specialised equipment and devices; Additional travel requirements for visits/interviews or auditions; and personal items.
