Audiences can expect an eclectic mix of performances that reflect contemporary themes, personal narratives, and experimental forms, all crafted with passion and originality.


unTaPped '25 isn't just a festival - it's a launchpad for the next generation of theatre-makers!





It was filled with two and half minute pieces, either monologues or duologues, and we all had an opportunity to showcase our strengths and introduce ourselves in the industry.


We are truly blessed to have so much support and love towards each other and cannot wait to begin rehearsals after Easter for our final end of year show!
