Privacy Notice - Guest Speakers



1. Introduction and purpose

This Privacy Notice is for individuals whose data is processed by LTE Group in relation to guest speaking at our events (for example, conferences and training initiatives).

This Notice provides information that is in addition to information contained in our <u>main suite of privacy</u> <u>notices</u> and <u>Data Protection Policy</u>. Please do read these documents to understand our practices and if you have any questions, please contact us using the details provided below.

2. The kind of information we hold about you

Personal data, or personal information, means any information about an individual from which that person can be identified. It does not include data where the identity has been removed (anonymous data).

Some of the personal data collected will be classed as being 'special category personal data'*. Access to and sharing of this information is controlled very carefully.

The categories of personal information that we may collect, store, and use about you may include:

We may need to collect further personal data directly from/about you during the course of our engagement with you.

3. How is your personal information collected?

Your information is typically collected through our initial processes to arrange your guest appearance – for example, via our external speaker form and through our correspondence with yourself. On occasion we use third-party agencies to establish and source recommended speakers, and similarly from external networking, for example with other education providers and government bodies.

On site, we collect information at our campuses via our signing-in process and images/footage via our CCTV and camera systems.

Following events, we process personal information via our evaluation process.

4. How will we use information about you?

The information we collect will allow us to arrange your guest speech/appearance at our event(s) and to fulfil our arrangement with you.

Data protection laws require us to meet certain conditions before we are allowed to use your personal data in the manner described in this Privacy Notice, including having a "lawful basis" for the processing. Where we process special category personal data we are required to establish an additional lawful basis for processing that data.















Some of the below grounds for processing will overlap and there may be several grounds which justify our use of your personal information. We may process your personal information without your knowledge or consent where this is required or permitted by law.

Do we need your consent?

We do not generally process your personal data based on your consent (as we can usually rely on another lawful basis, as outlined in the table above). If we do process your personal information based on your consent, we will inform you of this before we start the processing and you will have the right to withdraw your consent at any time.

5. If you fail to provide personal information

If you fail to provide certain information when requested, you may not be able to feature in an event for us.

6. Change of purpose

We will only use your personal information for the purposes for which we collected it, unless we reasonably consider that we need to use it for another reason and that reason is compatible with the original purpose. If we need to use your personal information for an unrelated purpose, we will notify you and we will explain the legal basis which allows us to do so.

Please note that we may process your personal information without your knowledge or consent, in compliance with the above rules, where this is required or permitted by law.

7. Automated decision-making

Automated decision-making takes place when an electronic system uses personal information to make a decision without human intervention. We do not envisage that any decisions will be taken about you using automated means, however, we will notify you in writing if this position changes.

8. Data sharing

We may share your personal data with third parties where essential to comply with our legal and contractual obligations, and with hosted technology solution providers.

The images and film we take will likely be placed into the public domain. This includes within our internal and external publications, printed media, prospectuses, on our websites, social media accounts, billboards / hoardings and other public domain advertising, and within adverts placed with specific third parties, (e.g. Google, Facebook and Instagram). As such, published photographs / film are available to anyone who has access to the internet, social media channels or printed materials etc in which the photo(s) or video(s) feature. All parties who we share data with are required to take appropriate security measures to protect your personal information, in line with our policies. We do not allow our third-party service providers/data processors to use your personal data for their own purposes. We only permit them to process your personal data for specified purposes and in accordance with our instructions.

Your data may be transferred outside of the UK, for example, where we use third party providers to deliver our services, such as externally hosted software or cloud providers who store data globally. We undertake strict due diligence on all partners to ensure that they have the adequate safeguards in place to protect your data under Article 46 GDPR.

9. Data retention

We will only retain your personal information for as long as necessary to fulfil the purposes we collected it for, subject to any statutory obligations.

Full details of retention periods are available in our in our **Records Management Policy** and **Data Retention Schedule** (available on request from dpo@ltegroup.co.uk).

In some circumstances we may anonymise your personal information so that it can no longer be associated with you, in which case we may use such information without further notice to you.

Once we no longer require access to your personal information we will retain and securely destroy it in accordance with our data retention policy and applicable laws and regulations.

10. Your individual rights in connection with personal data

Subject to certain conditions, you have the following rights in relation to your personal data:

Access to your personal information (known as the Right of Access/a Subject Access Request)

Rectification of the personal information we hold about you if it is inaccurate

Erasure of your personal information (in certain circumstances)

Restriction of processing of your personal information

To be **Informed** about the processing your personal information

Transfer of your personal information to another party

Objection to processing of your personal information

Suspension of processing of your personal information
